



Crimsonband wrasse

Notolabrus gymnogenis



A well-known New South Wales coastal reef species. In Tasmania, this species is known in Bass Strait and around the Kent Group. Log this species whenever you spot it in Tasmanian waters.

Eastern blue groper

Achoerodus viridis



Common and well-known in New South Wales. Log this species whenever you spot it in Tasmanian waters.

Eastern rock lobster

Jasus verreauxi



Current Tasmanian range is unknown, but expected to be more common on the east coast. Log this species whenever you spot it in Tasmanian waters.

Gloomy octopus

Octopus tetricus



Current Tasmanian range is unknown, but expected to be more common on the east coast. Log this species whenever you spot it in Tasmanian waters.

Grey morwong

Nemadactylus douglasii



A well-known New South Wales species. Log this species whenever you spot it in Tasmanian waters.

Halfbanded seaperch

Hypoplectrodes maccullochi



Known from northern New South Wales to northern and north-eastern Tasmania. Rare sightings at Maria Island. Log it if you spot it south of Bicheno.

Herring cale

Olisthops cyanomelas



Known in northern Tasmania and south to Tasman Peninsula. Log it if you spot it south of Tasman Peninsula.

Luderick

Girella tricuspidata



Known in northern and north-eastern Tasmania. Log a luderick sighting if you spot it on the east coast (south of St Helens) or along the west or south coasts.

Mado

Atypichthys strigatus



Known in Bass Strait and down the east coast to Tasman Peninsula. Log it if you spot it south of Tasman Peninsula or off the west or south coasts – or directly off the mid north coast.

Mahi mahi (dolphin fish)

Coryphaena hippurus



Common to global tropical waters, this is a highly migratory species. Not common in Tasmania. Log this species whenever you spot it in Tasmanian waters.

Southern Maori wrasse

Ophthalmolepis lineolatus



Associated with the Kent Group in Tasmania. Log the Southern Maori wrasse whenever you spot it in Tasmanian waters.

Old wife

Enoplosus armatus



Common in Bass Strait, and northern and north-eastern Tasmania. Log it if you spot it south of Maria Island.



Onespot puller

Chromis hypsilepis



Common around Bass Strait and the Kent Group. Log it whenever you spot it south of the Kent Group.

Rainbow cale

Heteroscarus acroptilus



Found in northern Bass Strait and south to Maria Island. Log it if you spot it south of Maria Island or on the north coast of Tasmania.

Rock blackfish

Girella elevata



Identified in eastern Bass Strait and on the east coast of Tasmania. Log it if you spot it in the north-west or west coast, or south of St Helens on the east coast.

Rock cale

Aplodactylus lophodon



Rock cale is very unusual in Tasmanian waters. Log it if you spot it in Tasmanian waters.

Snakeskin wrasse

Eupetrichthys angustipes



Isolated to the Kent Group, Tasmania. Log the snakeskin wrasse whenever you spot it in Tasmanian waters.

Snapper

Pagrus auratus



This is a tricky one but REDMAP is trying to find out more about its population in the south and its seasonal variation. Log it if you spot it south of Maria Island or on the south or west coasts.

Tailor

Pomatomus saltatrix



Known in northern Tasmania and anecdotally considered to be becoming more common in southern Tasmania. Log it if you spot it south of St Helens.

Tiger shark

Galeocerdo cuvier



This shark is usually associated with warmer regions. Not common to Tasmania. Log this species whenever you spot it in Tasmanian waters.

White-ear

Parma microlepis



Known in northern Tasmania, usually in Bass Strait. Juveniles are common further south. Log it if you spot it south of St Helens.

Yellowtail kingfish

Seriola lalandi



Well-known in northern Tasmania and along the east coast. Anecdotally considered to be becoming more common in southern Tasmania. Log it if you spot it south of Maria Island.

Zebrafish

Girella zebra



Common in Bass Strait and northern Tasmania. Log it if you spot it on the east, west or south coasts.
