Mother avoids further jail for her child's death

PERTH — A woman convicted of fatally stabbing her 15-month-old daughter has walked free from a Perth court after a judge said she had suffered enough.

Nicole Frances Bryan, 23,

stabbed her daughter Chenelle with a long-bladed kitchen knife as she was cradled in the arms of her father, Geoffrey Miller, at their Dawesville home, south of Perth, in March last year.

She told police she had targeted Miller in the attack and accidentally stabbed her daughter.

Bryan had been held in custody since the stabbing.

Indian airports on alert after hijack warning

NEW DELHI — India has increased airport security and warned its domestic airlines about a possible hijack attempt after a tip-off from Western intelligence services, officials said yesterday.

The alert to India's civil aviation ministry warned that flights of Air India and other private carriers could be targeted by Islamist groups aligned to al-Qaeda or the Pakistan-based Lashkar-e-Taiba rebel group.

The alert warns of flights from India or originating in countries neighbouring India being specific targets.

"It's so basic to our industry — once they're aware of it they will vary the award back in favour of the baking industry," Mr Duc said.

Mr Duc said the association was involved in the award modernisation consultation process but such oversights were inevitable because it was "just too big a job".

Mr Dilger said the reform was never going to be easy but the Federal Government needed to throw more resources into explaining the new workplace laws.
